NATIONAL NEWS/POLITICS:

Election results show this morning that

Hillary Clinton and John McCain were the winners in yesterday's California presidential primaries respectively defeating Senator Barack of Illinois and former Massachusetts Governor Mitt Romney and Arkansas governor Mike Huckabee. CNN estimates that Clinton currently holds 820 delegates to Obama's 720 and McCain has 620 to Romney's 270, and Huckabee's 176. Voters also approved propositions 94-97 the four Indian gaming

measures on yesterday's ballot.

Proposition 91 about transportation funding, Proposition 92 which would have lowered community college fees and guaranteed community colleges a minimum level of funding, and Proposition 93 limiting legislators' terms in office all failed to pass.

GENERAL INTEREST NEWS:

Do you feel guilty letting your kids watch TV? Well, it might not be as bad as you think. According to a new study, there is no link between the amount of time a child spends watching television and physical activity. The survey found that by the time children reach high school, girls watched 39 minutes less per week of TV, but they also spent 13

minutes less doing physical activities. The boys watched 23 minutes less of TV, and they also spent 13 minutes less exercising.

HEALTH/FITNESS:

Here in the United States, the number of deaths related to cancer is higher among black Americans than white Americans. A new study from the American Cancer Society

shows that the cancer death rate is 35 percent higher for black men compared to white men and 18 percent higher in black women compared to white women. Increases in tobacco usage, poor nutrition, higher obesity rates and lack of insurance are all reasons for these statistics. This year, the American Cancer Society estimates there will be more than 150,000 new cancer cases and more than 60,000 cancer-related deaths among black individuals.

ENTERTAINMENT NEWS:

While Hollywood and his many fans are still mourning actor Heath Ledger, his death was determined to be the result of an accidental overdose of painkillers, sleeping pills, anti-anxiety medication and other prescription drugs. The newly released autopsy, revealed that the cumulative effects of the six prescription medicines contributed to his death. Earlier in November, Ledger had complained of being unable to sleep after completing his latest projects "The Dark Night" and "I'm Not There" and said sleeping pills were not helping.
