NATIONAL NEWS:

Tuesday, February 5th also known as Super Tuesday is the California Presidential Primary. This week in fact the candidates will be in the Southland for the Republican debate on Wednesday and the Democratic Debate on Thursday. But the presidential candidates aren't the only things on the ballot that should have your attention. Along with your local officials and ballot measures, there are some statewide propositions that you should be aware of. For example there's :

Proposition 91 which would prohibit certain motor vehicle fuel sales and use taxes from being retained in the General Fund. It would also extend the date for repayment of those taxes and change how and when borrowing of certain transportation funds is allowed. Fiscally it increases the stability of state funding for highways, streets, and roads but may decrease the stability of state and local funding for public transit.

There is also Proposition 92 which if passed would establish in the state constitution a system of independent public community college districts and Board of Governors. In addition it requires minimum levels of state funding for school districts and community college districts to be calculated separately, while allocating 10.46 percent of current school funding to community colleges. It limits community college fees at \$15/unit per semester, and provides funding to community college districts that would not otherwise receive general fund revenues. The fiscal impact is an increase in education spending to \$300 million a year and a 70-million a year loss of student fee revenues to community colleges.

Plus, Proposition 93 would reduce the total amount of time a person may serve in the state legislature from 14 to 12 years, and allow a person to serve a total of 12 years either in the Assembly, the Senate, or a combination of both. It would also provide a transition period to allow current members to serve a total of 12 consecutive years in the house in which they are currently serving, regardless of any prior service in another house.

Named as a tribute to local rancher and dentist, Dr. David Burbank, the city gradually evolved from a sheep ranch to what many now consider as the media capital of the world. And through the power of a camera lens, and the benefit of memory, one man guides us along the journey of Burbank's evolution throughout much of the 20th century.

Declining enrollment has prompted the Los Angeles Unified School District to scale back a \$20 billion school construction and remodeling program meant to relieve overcrowding and end involuntary busing. Since the fall, the school system has canceled plans for 19 new schools and additions to existing campuses. The Board of Education recently downsized five new schools, eliminating more than 1,000 seats, and last year, the district decided against building seven others. Overall, enrollment in the nation's second-largest school system is down 7 percent from its peak in 2003 according to The L-A Times.
