## Upland Overview

Nestled against the San Gabriel mountains in the shadow of Mount Baldy is the quiet city of Upland. Covering 15 square miles in western San Bernardino County, it was known as North Ontario.

By the time the city was incorporated in 1906 it had changed its name to Upland. Originally established by brothers George and William Chaffey, Upland was once a center for agriculture with the area teeming with citrus and grape crops...in the early days most of the population worked either in the production or packing of lemons and oranges. Over the years the orchards have disappeared but the early charm has not disappeared with the Upland adopting the nickname of the city of gracious living.

And the years of gracious living is evident in the dozens of historic homes that line Euclid Avenue and the surrounding neighborhoods...many of the homes dating back to the turn of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. Euclid Avenue itself also has a colorful history.

A local landmark the Madonna of the trail statue --one of 12 identical monuments dedicated nationwide in 1920's honoring the spirit of the pioneer women can be found at the intersection of Euclid Avenue and Foothill blvd.

Today more than 70,000 people call Upland home and it continues to be a unique mixture of old and new...the historic downtown area has been part of the community for 100 years and still attracts locals and out of towners alike. That downtown area still features a traditional band stand and round about along with shops and restaurants But Upland is also committed to being a city with modern conveniences as well.

Upland is also home to Cable airport which was first established back in 1945 and stakes the claim to being which the largest privately owned airport in the world.

Gary L. Freed, M.D. comments:

"The first set of booster vaccines actually occurs when children are four years of age."

At four, there are boosters for measles, mumps and rubella, polio, tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis. Then another tetanus and pertussis booster at age 11 or 12.

Gary L. Freed, M.D. comments:

"Pertussis or whooping cough is actually getting to be more and more common in adolescence and older children."

The vaccine boosts confidence for many parents of growing children.

Lori Weber comments:

"Unfortunately, there are so many things going around. They can still catch so many things you really need to protect them still."

Nick's also receiving the new vaccine for bacterial meningitis, an infection that causes inflammation in the brain and spinal cord.

Gary L. Freed, M.D. comments:

"And can ultimately cause either the loss of limbs and subsequently death."
